

## Hot and Cold places- Key Facts

The hot places in the world are closest to the equator and the coolest places are furthest away from the equator.


When we look at the weather in one place over a long period of time, we call this its climate.

Our world is getting hotter. This is affecting the weather in different parts of the world. We call this climate change. The weather tells us what its like outside each day.

On Antarctica there are only research stations for scientists and no permanent settlements.

Unlike Antarctica, the Arctic is NOT a continent because it is not a landmass.
