Welcome back!

We hope you enjoyed the break and are looking forward to an exciting term ahead. Our topic this half-term is

Let's Explore!

This booklet will explain what your child will be learning over the coming weeks and how you can support their progress at home.

Maths



In maths, we will be focusing on shape, money, multiplication and geometry. To help your child at home, you could look at money together, and add amounts, count in 2s, 5s and 10s, and learn the multiplication facts.

Look for 2D and 3D shapes around you and talk about their properties, such as number of faces, edges and vertices.

Writing

This half-term we will be focusing on writing a descriptive piece focused on Billy Goat's Gruff. We will be using adjectives to describe a character in detail.

To help your child at home, please make sure you read a range of texts to them regularly and ask them to talk about events and characters.

You could write your own version of a familiar story, just by changing one of the characters or the problem in the story.



Reading

Reading books will be changed once a week and we will write comments about how well your child is reading in school.

Please make sure you write comments **daily** about how reading is progressing at home. Regular reading is vital to your child becoming a confident writer. Visit your local library to access an even wider range of texts!



Grammar and Punctuation

This half-term we will be focusing on punctuation and different types of sentences and words.

You could help your child by talking about punctuation they find in their reading books—full stops, question marks, commas, speech marks. Encourage them to say and write questions about a topic which interests them.

Science

In science lessons, we will be identifying different plants and discovering what they need to grow.

We will explore and compare the differences between things that are living, that are dead and that have never been alive.



Geography

In geography, we will be identifying the key features of a location in order to say whether it is a city, town, village, coastal or rural area.

We will also be devising simple maps and using grid references.



History

In history, we will be finding out about the life of Amelia Earhart and investigating the changes that took place during her lifetime.



Art

In art, we will be learning about textiles and weaving. We will be learning at the artist Gunta Stolzl.



Design Technology

In DT, we will be designing and making our own flatbread wraps, including healthy fillings!

Brilliant Beginning

This term our Brilliant Beginning will be a day dedicated to plants. We will be finding different plants around school and discussing their various properties.
