Writing

This half-term we will begin by looking at how you construct an engaging narrative, which will be based upon the class book 'Treason'.



Children will be applying their understanding of grammar and spelling rules to the structure of a narrative.

Grammar and Punctuation

In SPaG, we will be focusing on developing our application of a range of sentence types. We will be using a range of clauses in order to develop our understanding of when to use different tools for effect.

Reading

Children will have access to reading books in class. Please encourage your child to read at home and discuss the book that they are currently reading. Regular reading is vital to child becoming a confident writer.



This term, we will be reading 'Treason' by Berlie Doherty, Macbeth story and 'The Island' by Armin Greder.

History

In history, we will be looking at what life was like in the Tudor times and how their struggles and achievements shaped our society today. Specifically, we will be learning about significant changes in the Tudor era and its impact on modern day life. We will also be developing our understanding of chronology by creating a timeline of the era.

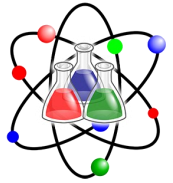


Religious Education
